Termly parents forums to engage hard to reach families	£20	The number of parents attending arose from 3 to 12 throughout the year and plans were developed for additional training and support for key parents
Subsidised school journey	£2600	Funding was made available to year 6 pupils (PPG) and low income families to ensure they experienced a wider and enriched curriculum experience.

Booster club provision after school, small group/individual pupil withdrawal for year 2 & year 6	£249 £9,000	Monitoring took place 6 times over the year to ensure that identified pupils were making expected progress and findings were reported back to governors'. PPG pupils were in line to achieve ARE in January and March.
